OUR **CHILDREN**



We presently have 6 children in our care.

Three are boys aged 16 months, 18 months and 2½ years, and three are girls aged 12 days, 4 months, and 7months old.

Our three boys are growing out of their clothes rapidly, so if anyone can assist with 18 to 24 month old winter clothes, please consider donating it for these little boys.

Four of our babies are currently teething. Ouch!

Baby "E" continues to receive prescription medication twice daily, and she is enjoying the introduction to solid foods, while Toddler "I", was diagnosed with TB. He is responding well to his daily medication.

This did result in staff testing as well, and fortunately the results were negative.

Good news! Our baby "C" has been adopted after spending the first 3 months of his life with us. He is happy and flourishing with his new family.

Baby "J" has finally, after 1 year and 6 months, been registered with home affairs and we received his birth certificate on the 7th of July. He is now eligible for adoption. Going forward his social worker will be able to claim temporary safety fees for him.

Baby "E" has, after 7 months, also found a loving home and will be joining her adoptive parents on the 27th of this month.

Toddler "A" still enjoys periodic foster weekends.

We received a tiny, prematurely born girl on the 12th of July, and on the 13th a newborn boy was brought to us by his mother. A social worker was called in, and after counseling, the mother chose to place the baby in foster care instead. Temporary foster placement could only be arranged for the next day since all the other baby safe homes were also full. Baby stayed overnight, and was introduced to his foster parent the next day.

James 1:27 says, "Religion that is pure and undefiled before God, the Father, is this: to visit orphans and widows in their affliction, and to keep oneself unstained from the world."

These words of the Bible call God's people to actively pursue meeting the needs of children who have been orphaned, and a great place to start is through prayer. Your actions matter and there are many ways you can help make a difference, whether you are a prayer partner, a fundraiser, a Show Hope Sponsor, a prospective adoptive parent, or a volunteer



BABY ABADONMENT ACROSS SOUTH AFRICA

Every year, over 10 000 babies are abandoned in South Africa, with the vast majority of them found dead. This is according to Baby Savers South Africa, a national coalition of organisations working to put an end to unsafe infant abandonment.

Baby Savers South Africa says teenage pregnancies and poverty are some of the main reasons why thousands of babies are abandoned yearly.

Care facilities for abandoned infants assist those who are taken to the police stations when found alive. Others come from hospitals and some babies are simply left at the Safe Home doors. Often the homes also deal with mums that have no food, clothing or blankets. Poverty, gender based violence, rape, and teenage pregnancy are large contributors to baby abandonment.

Unsafe abortions also remain a massive challenge in South Africa where mothers are attempting illegal abortions in their third trimester. A lot of babies are abandoned due to failed abortions. Born alive, only to die from unsafe abandonment.

We need to focus on the factors that force mothers into abandoning their babies; largely poverty, teenage pregnancy and gender based violence.
